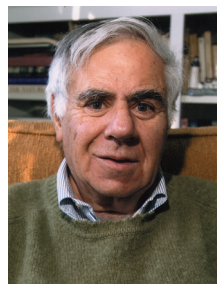

AUTHOR AND HISTORIAN



In his new book, *Maine in the World: Stories of Some of Those from Here Who Went Away* (Tilbury House), former UNE trustee and noted author and historian Neil Rolde tells the stories of Mainers who left their mark. From the famous such as poets Henry Wadsworth Longfellow,

Pulitzer Prize winner Edna St. Vincent Millay, and Hollywood movie director John Ford, to the lesser known such as Sir William Phips, the wilderness shepherd boy who went to sea, found a Spanish treasure and was knighted by the king of England, Rolde captures a range of Mainers' contributions to the world at large.

A former legislator and an award-winning historian, Neil Rolde is the author of *Continental Liar from the State of Maine: James G. Blaine*; *Unsettled Past, Unsettled Future: The Story of Maine Indians*; *The Interrupted Forest: A History of Maine's Wildlands*, and many other books. He lives in York, Maine.
